#### **Thomas James Store**

The Thomas James Store, owned by the Mathews County Historical Society, is an A-framed commercial structure that was built by 1820. It is one of the best preserved stores in the South and is on the National Register of Historic Places. Originally located on Main Street, it was moved to its current location behind the Sibley's General Store in 1899.

The Mathews County Historical Society received a grant administered by the Virginia Department of Historic Resources to repair the foundation and lift the structure as protection for its continued preservation. The building sits on land that is basically the size of the footprint of the building.

As the project commenced, it was discovered that the building sits just slightly over the property's boundary with Maple Avenue. Therefore, in order for a building permit to be approved, a new survey had to be completed and an application for a boundary adjustment had to be made.

This boundary modification required the approval of the Mathews County Board of Supervisors. Project Manager Marsha Carlton spoke in favor of this boundary line adjustment at the March 21<sup>st</sup> Board of Supervisors meeting. It was unanimously approved. We are currently awaiting the boundary adjustment paperwork to be filed by the Mathews County attorney and the building permit to be issued. Storybound Construction stands ready to start the project as soon as the building permit is issued by the county.

We would like to thank Frances Hudgins, architect with Hudgins Design Collaborative; Gordon Jones with Bay Design; Paul Hatton, Michael Swiderski and Mike Rowe with Storybound Construction; Caitlyn Sylvester and Will Harris of the Virginia Department of Historical Resources; and Reed Lawson, Hunt Thompson and Martha McCartney of the MCHS for their combined and continued efforts to complete this project. We look forward to celebrating the re-opening of this historic gem in Mathews County.


